What is NAAB?

The New Adult Advisory Board (NAAB) is a volunteer opportunity for young adults in the Kingston-Frontenac community to participate in the planning of library programs and events for new adults. NAAB members must be between the ages of 18 and 30.

What do NAAB members do?

Plan and promote programs for new adults.

Participate in community events.

Recommend books, magazines, music, DVDs, and other materials for the library to purchase.

Assist staff in developing a Summer Reading Challenge for adults.

What is the time commitment?

NAAB members attend monthly meetings (1.5 hours/meeting) and other NAAB events throughout the year.

Meetings are on the first Thursday of each month, from 6 - 7:30 p.m. at the Central Branch.

What are we looking for in NAAB members?

The Kingston Frontenac Public Library is interested in recruiting volunteers who enjoy community-building and want to help new adults connect with library services and programs.

Accepted NAAB members are required to provide a Police Information Check completed by the Kingston Police Force. KFPL will provide details about this process, and will reimburse eligible members after they have attended three meetings.
